Data is based on recommendations from the International Labour Organization (ILO).
Employed: Comprise employees, self-employed persons and assisting spouses. In order to be classified as employed, a person must work, i.e. perform labour against some form of payment for at least one hour during the reference period
Unemployed: Persons out of work who are available to start working within two weeks and are actively seeking a job
Not in the labour force: Includes young people still pursuing their education and those engaged in work without compensation as well as the retired and disabled.
Labour force: The sum of employed and unemployed. Figures may not add up because of rounding.
Unemployment rate: Unemployed in percent of the labour force.
Employment rate: Employed in percent of total number of people aged 15-64 (mean or average population during the year).
