ment, on a sheep farm or at a hunting outpost, the figure now is less than every fifth person, but it is a slow development while the trend is obvious: people move from the settlements to the towns.

Removals, and possibly regional differences in the excess of births during the period from 1960 to 2002, have resulted in the major part of the population now living in the open waters-region on the west coast. The fall in population has been especially pronounced in the Disko-region and South Greenland.

As per 1 January 2002 there were 21,713 households in Greenland; the figure is based on information from the Statistical Population Register. The distribution of the households by municipality is shown in Key Table 4.4. In this survey a household is defined as being all the persons having an identical address registered in the National Register. Viewed in this way the average household numbered 2.6 persons. In the settlements the average household size was

somewhat higher, viz. 3.1 persons per household. The survey of the total number of households is not as reliable as other statistical population surveys as the information from the National Register is used here at a very detailed level.700 persons did not belong to any household. The majority of this group live outside the municipalities.

## 4.1.2 Population projection 2002-2012

It is not possible to predict with any certainty the exact size and composition of the future population. In the spring of 2002 Statistics Greenland published the results of a population projection for Greenland in *Grønlands Befolkning 1. januar 2002* (Population of Greenland as per 1 January 2002) in the series *Befolkning* (Population). Excerpts from this projection are also included in this yearbook.
