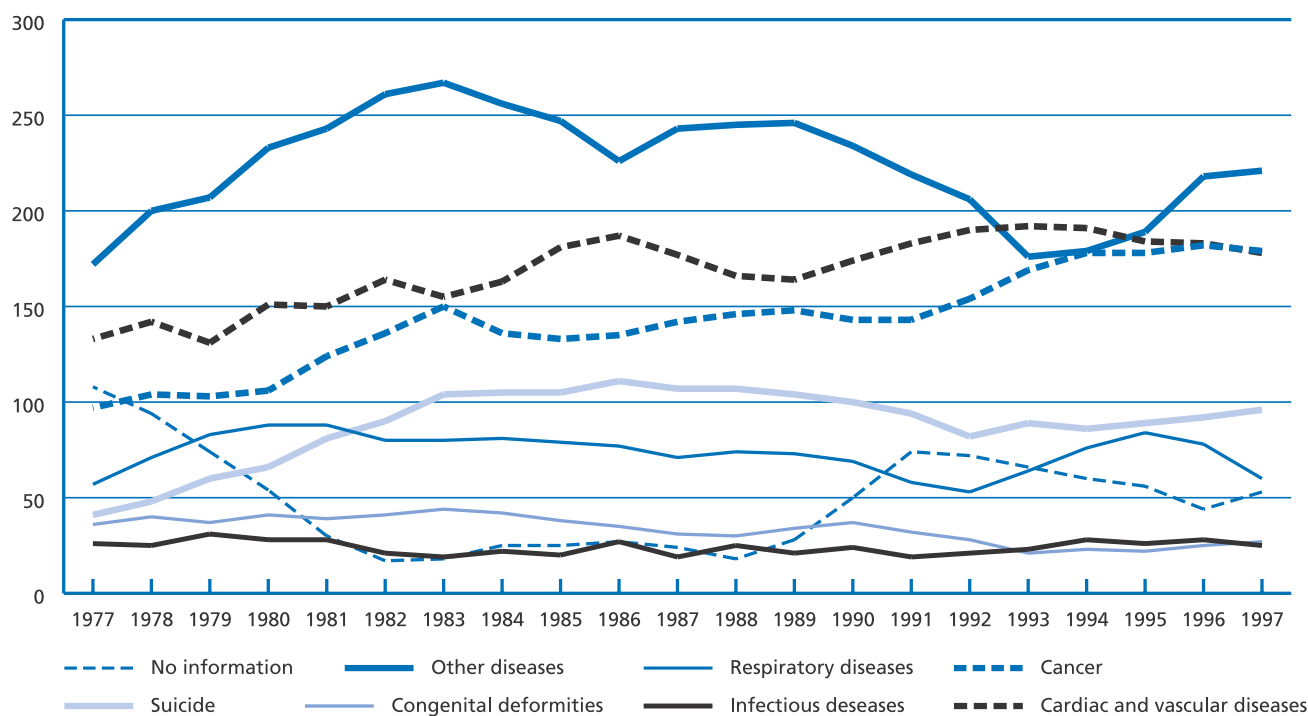


Figure 17.6 Death quotients distributed by cause 1977-1997 per 100,000. 3-year floating average

Note: Since 1997 the method of recording has been changed, bed-days now being recorded as in Denmark. Previously, the number of bed-days were recorded as the day of discharge minus the date of admission plus one bed-day; the day of discharge is now no longer recorded though a minimum of one day is always registered. This means that the number of bed-days for most patients will be reduced by one.

The figures from 1997 and 1998 only include 24-hour patients residing in Greenland or Denmark.
