#2 The geographical area of activity of the Sami Development Fund North of Saltfjellet. The 2005 area definition is used for all years.

#3 Live births include all foetuses which show signs of life at the time of birth.

#4 Migration to/from other localities in Norway and abroad.

#5 Population growth is calculated as the difference between the population at 1 January in the year in question and that at 1 January in the following year. Due to the recording routines employed and variations in the quality of migration data for basic statistical units in individual municipalities, there will be differences from the birth-death+immigration-emigration figures. At municipal level, these differences will be small, but may be significant for some individual municipalities, such as in the statistics for the SDF areas.
