

## Comprehensive schools had 553,300 pupils in 2009

According to Statistics Finland, comprehensive schools had 553,300 pupils in 2009. The number of pupils in comprehensive school fell by 1.4 per cent from the year before. Forty-nine per cent of the pupils in comprehensive school were girls and 51 per cent were boys.

There were 3,065 active comprehensive schools in autumn 2009, which was 109 schools fewer than in the year before. Municipalities ran 97 per cent of the comprehensive schools.
