

Students in curriculum-based basic vocational education numbered 126,100 in 2007

According to Statistics Finland, the number of students in curriculum-based vocational education provided by educational institutions was 126,100 in 2007.

New students numbered 48,500. The number of students was 0.3 per cent higher and that of new students one per cent lower than one year previously. Fifty-four per cent of students were men.

A total of two-thirds of the students were studying in the fields of technology and transport (42 per cent), welfare and health (14 per cent) and tourism, catering and economics (13 per cent).

Data on students describe the situation of 20 September.
