

Comprehensive schools had 546,400 pupils in 2010

According to Statistics Finland, comprehensive schools had 546,400 pupils in 2010. The number of pupils in comprehensive school fell by 1.2 per cent from the year before. Forty-nine per cent of the pupils in comprehensive school were girls and 51 per cent were boys.
