- Aggregates are not always equal to the sum of their components from 1984 to 1996. This is caused by changing the set of relative prices when a new base year is adopted. To avoid any discontinuity, all levels of aggregation were linked back to 1984 using their original movement. For some of the lowest levels of aggregation, it is not possible to have an homogeneous series from 1984 to the present. For that reason, special industry groupings that provide relatively good continuity were created back to 1984.
