## Footnotes:

2. This table was previously released March 30, 2015. This current version of the table has been modified from the original version by (1) the addition of provincial and territorial data, and (2) the recalculation of some percentages, based on the overall total for the variable (see footnote 10).
3. Excludes persons living on Indian reserves or settlements.
4. "Long-term health problems (self-reported)" refers to whether or not a person has reported that a health professional has diagnosed him or her with a long-term or chronic medical condition. Long-term or chronic conditions are those which have lasted, or are expected to last, six months or more. Respondents aged 12 and over were asked a different series of questions on long-term health problems compared with the population aged 6 to 11, although a few of the long-term health problems asked about were common to both age groups.
5. Aboriginal identity includes persons living off reserve who reported being an Aboriginal person, that is, First Nations (North American Indian), Métis or Inuk (Inuit) and/or those who reported Registered or Treaty Indian status, that is registered under the Indian Act of Canada, and/or those who reported membership in a First Nation or Indian band. The sum of the categories included in this variable is greater than the total population estimate for Aboriginal identity because a person may have reported more than one Aboriginal identity: for example, a person could self-identify as both First Nations and Métis.
6. Proxy reporting was used in the 2012 Aboriginal Peoples Survey for most children aged 6 to 11 years.
7. Atlantic includes Newfoundland and Labrador, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick.
8. Registered or Treaty Indian status refers to whether or not a person reported being a Registered or Treaty Indian. Registered Indians are persons who are registered under the Indian Act of Canada. Treaty Indians are persons who belong to a First Nation or Indian band that signed a treaty with the Crown. Registered or Treaty Indians are sometimes also called Status Indians.
9. Respondents aged 6 to 11 were asked a series of questions on long-term health problems, each question beginning with "Has a health professional diagnosed any of the following long-term conditions for (name of respondent):", followed by a specific long-term health problem, to which the respondent, or, most commonly, the proxy for the respondent, could answer "Yes" or "No". The sum of the categories included in this variable is greater than the total population estimate for "With long-term health problems" because a person may have reported more than one long-term health problem.
10. All percentages for the variable "long-term health problems (self-reported)" are calculated using the number of persons in "total, long-term health problems (self-reported)" as denominator.
11. "Allergies" include food or digestive allergy, respiratory allergy, or any other allergy.
12. Other long-term conditions include bronchitis, autism, diabetes, tuberculosis, developmental disability or disorder, fetal alcohol spectrum disorder (FASD) (includes fetal alcohol syndrome and fetal alcohol effects) or any other long-term physical or mental health condition.
13. "Not specified if has a long-term health problem" consists of item non-response ("Refusal", "Don't know", and "Not stated").
14. Bootstrapping techniques were used to produce the coefficient of variation (CV).
15. Data with a coefficient of variation (CV) from 16.6% to 33.3% are identified by an (E) and should be interpreted with caution.
16. Data with a coefficient of variation (CV) greater than 33.3% were suppressed (F) due to extreme sampling variability.
